### VISIBILITY CAMPAIGN







Councils are encouraged to have at least one event on a Sunday every month (ideally an event every Sunday) in church like Prayers in the Pew, in front of the church like fundraisers for parish programs, or near the church in conjunction with parish events. This way the parishioners see with their own eyes the different activities the councils do in the parishes. Hopefully these events will make them more curious about the Knights of Columbus, entice them to know more about our fraternity, and encourage and motivate them to join.







Another approach is to submit to <a href="mailto:programs@californiaknights.org">programs@californiaknights.org</a> action photos of council/district events with short writeups/captions for release in the state website, the state facebook in case councils do not have a facebook account, and in Constant Contact which reaches out to more than 55,000 of our brother knights. (Note: action photos and no firing squad photos). Our State Office has come out with a monthly newsletter. For the programs page, we would like to showcase the different council events through photos and brief captions (5Ws and 1H).

# The Campesinos (Farmworkers) Program (El Programa para los Campesinos)

California has many riches, including it being a state that is 80% agriculture, with tens of thousands of campesinos. Most individuals do not know that farmworkers are a large part of the working poor. They have seasonal jobs that most of the time do not afford them the basic necessities, for example, <u>food</u> being the number one need. This program is meant to assist our farmworkers and their families through a variety of already established Knights of Columbus programs.

#### **FORM 10784**

Councils are encouraged to submit Form 10784 ( <u>Fraternal Program Report Form</u>) immediately after completion of the event. This can be done by online form submission. Councils can use this link to report program activity <a href="https://www.kofc.org/en/forms/spa/invite.html?lang=en&form=10784C.019">https://www.kofc.org/en/forms/spa/invite.html?lang=en&form=10784C.019</a> and click on FORM INVITATION.

This report gives important real time data on council activities. Inputs are used in ongoing evaluation and improvements to our Faith in Action programs.

For the month of July, there were 61 forms submitted from 24 councils. For August, there were 81 forms

submitted from 34 councils. There is improvement but we need to continue improving on this. Additionally, incomplete submissions cannot be counted towards the yearly total of submissions when

councils are completing their Columbian Award applications (SP-7).

#### **FORM STSP**

Form STSP is used for the State Council Program Awards. You can access this in our state website <a href="https://www.californiaknights.org">www.californiaknights.org</a> under council forms.

Councils are encouraged to fill this form right after they submit Form 10784 to Supreme and keep this on file. By March, council can select the best top 4 and submit them before April 1 for the State Awards. We have 2 former state programs directors chairing the State Awards/Forms: Jim Hart and Tony Ransick.



#### **INCENTIVE**

The monthly \$100 Raffle incentive has been continued. Councils which provide program reports using the 10784 Form will be automatically entered into a monthly \$100 raffle. One raffle ticket for each form submitted. For July, there were 61 forms submitted and the winner is Council 16185 under District 70, Central Chapter. For August, there were 81 forms submitted and the winner is Council 4438 under District 98, Southern California Chapter.



#### SP-7

When preparing the SP-7, make use of the 10784 and STSP forms you have submitted. Submit SP-7 on or before June 1 to allow time to submit a revised one if the one submitted was not accepted or rejected.



#### **MEMBERSHIP AND PROGRAMS**

I believe in directing all councils to gather Catholic men and their families to our fold through the various faith in action programs where we would be able to activate them, as well as our current knights, to meaningful involvements in our parishes. If our members and candidates are inspired by our programs, if they find **meaning** in the things our councils do for the Knights of Columbus, they will constantly be involved with the Knights of Columbus and be energized to attend council meetings and participate in council events and programs.
