

Meeting of October 27, 1954

Meeting came to order by Grand Knight, Charles Kirby at 8:30 pm

	<p>AN EDITORIAL-THE WAY WE SEE IT</p>
	<p>Ever wonder what constitutes TIME and what exactly it is? We all do time on this earth in different and various ways and in many cases, the same way. God allows us the liberty to spend our time in the way we choose though he has given the Ten Commandments to guide us.</p> <p>I recently read somewhere that there are at least 338 words expressing time. Examples – daytime, nighttime, right time, last time, sometime, pastime, prime time, etc. In Cor. 4:18, St Paul expresses that things that are seen are “Temporal”, but things not seen are “Eternal”. Supposedly he was speaking of time because we do not understand time eternal, only what we see as time temporal.</p> <p>So, what really is time? Is it what we see? What we feel, what we imagine? Some scientists say it is an illusion. It could be all of these or</p>

none at all. We know that there is a past, present, and future and the physicists tell us that they all exist at the same time. Put it this way... You are just sitting around, and a thought comes to mind, (future) you think about it, (present) out of your mind (past) all this happens simultaneously. This happens over and over while you are alive.

Dr. Bradford Skow of MIT says “Everything that has happened and everything that will happen is occurring right now as time is positioned in space. Other scientists say, “that time flows like a river, or we move through time like a ship sailing through the Sea”. My version of time is that of a bucket. The bucket when full of water represents your time here on earth and the future. We all must die so that is represented by the hole in the bottom of the bucket. Our life span depends on the size of the hole. The future, present and past only occur at the point that the water (our life) runs through the hole leaving only the past as a small pond. The reflections from the pond represents our memories.

Time is a constant, measured by clocks and the Earth's relationship to the Sun and the Universe, so why does it appear that time flies if time is constant? Studies have shown that when things are going well for you like experiencing a fun filled vacation, getting married, winning an award, playing a great game of golf, or doing anything pleasant, your brain excretes chemicals accelerating your brain to think that time is going faster. In contrast, when things are not going well and you are having a terrible day, the brain slows, and time drags on. It seems like misery never ends.

Brother Knight's time is precious. It cannot be stored to be used later. It cannot be stopped then restarted, it relentlessly marches on. You are the one that has control over how you spend your time. Consider this, there are Knights that say they have no time for our meetings because they are busy. Then there are Knights that are not only busy in our Council, but busy with their families, businesses, and other organizations. Therefore, time can be defined as a priority.

As you drive through the highway of life, you look through your windshield with anticipation of new things to see, new family members (Babies) to greet, fellow human beings to befriend and help, and time of prayer of thanksgiving for the gift of your life. So, when you look through your rearview mirrors you hopefully see the

good that you left behind. When the road ahead of you is shorter than the road traveled that is behind you, remember and cherish the memories, but be eager and thankful for what yet has not been seen ahead.

Past Grand Knights

One such Knight is Shawn Carney member of Msgr. Allen Doga Council 14512 in Spring, Texas. Shawn began 40 Days for Life an initiative to pray peacefully at abortion facilities. In 2004 Shawn started the event when he was a college student. Since the program began, 600,000 participants in over 500 cities have join the vigil prayers; 8,245 lives saved, 44 clinics closed, and 88 clinic workers have quit. Shawn continues 40 Days for life and is proud to have the Knights support
